So i could only paddle out and follow him but took me so much longer to get out beyond the breakers. To think when i wipe out i couldn't swim so just dog paddled to the board. I don't think we had the nylon ankle straps back then... we used to go to shark's pit all the time and you know I never saw the sharks which is good!! remember another trip we did when we went to the pali area just after the lookout point on Honoapiilani Hwy towards Lahaina. Was a night dive for everybody, so my job was to keep the lantern on at the lava flow so that everybody knew where shore was. Good fun memories... Brian always enjoyed diving too and i remember growing up with fresh crab, lobster, tako, all kinds of fish... was so ono with the rice and chazuke Brian is finally at peace...

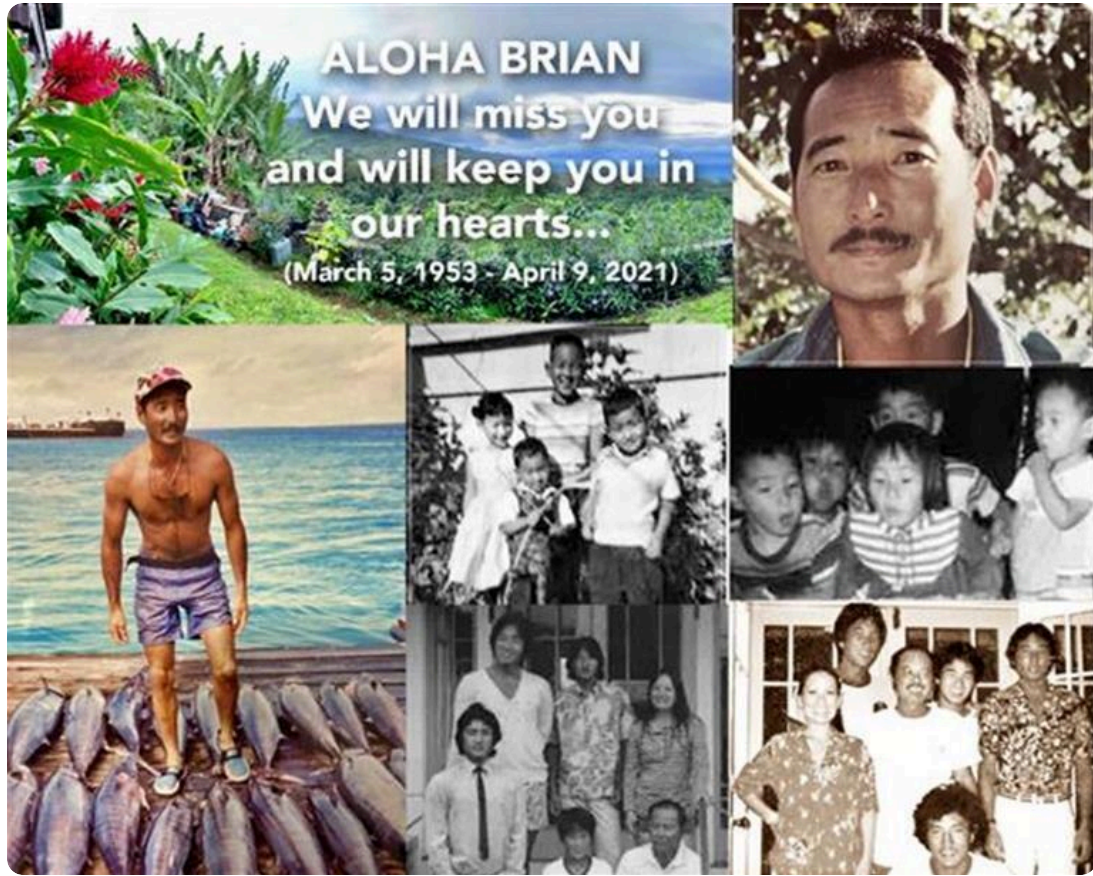

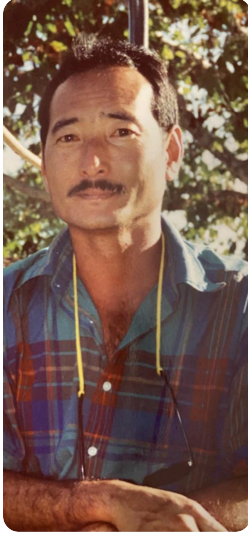
