Takeo “Shorty” Igawa, 95, passed away on Sunday, January 22, 2023 at Maui Memorial Medical Center with his loving daughter by his side. He was born on January 23, 1927, in Wailuku. He was one of eleven children born to Sakujiro and Hama (Kadomura) Igawa and also a twin to his brother Matsuo.

After graduating from Baldwin High School, Shorty joined the Army where he served in Japan during occupation. Upon returning to Maui he worked at and retired from Maui Pineapple Company with over 40 years of service.
