Representing Finland was one of the proudest achievements of my life because I felt so connected to everything Granny gave to us through her Finnish roots. We will always remember that Granny, Sisu, and Finland run deep within us.

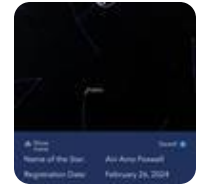

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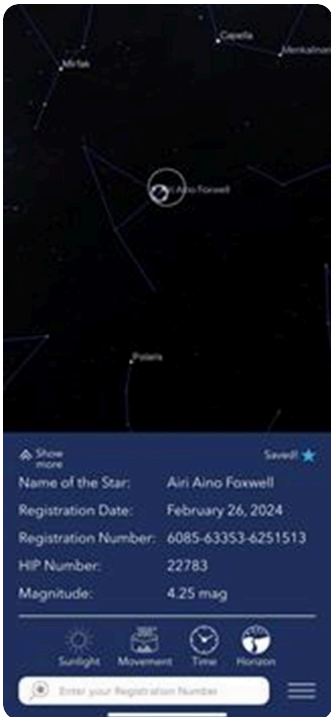
