Tsugio Hashimura, 89, of Lahaina, died on March 28, 2011 at Hale Makua Kahului. Visitation will begin at 9 a.m. Wednesday, April 13 at Nakamura Mortuary; with a service at 11 a.m. Burial will follow at 2 p.m. at Maui Memorial Park-Gardens of Meditation. Mr. Hashimura was born on Oct. 23, 1922, in Wailuku. He worked for Pioneer Mill for 50 years, since the age of 13 and he was a Blackbelt Aikido Sensei.
